

HORSE RACING BETS

STRAIGHT, SINGLE or WIN BET – A bet on a single horse to win.

PLACE – A bet on a single horse to come in first or second.

SHOW – A bet on a single horse to come in first, second or third.

QUINELLA – A bet on two horses to finish first and second in either order.

COMBINATION BET – A bet on two to four horses to win in chosen order.

- **PERFECTA or EXACTA** – A bet on two horses to finish in the exact chosen order.
- **TRIFECTA or TRICAST** – A bet on three horses to finish in the exact chosen order.
- **SUPERFECTA** – A bet on four horses to finish in the exact chosen order.

PICK 3 – A bet on the winning horses of three consecutive races. Some race tracks have a rolling pick 3 where the numbers picked for the first three races continue for any three race combinations.

PICK 6 – A bet on the winning horses of six consecutive races. The Pick 6 is chosen by the track as the first, middle or last 6 races. Many tracks have progressive pools (Jackpot) for the pick six that can grow into the \$millions.

PARLAY or ACCUMULATOR – A multiple bet wagered on two or more races with the intent of pressing the winnings of the first win to the bet of the following race, and so on. All selections must win in order to win the parlay. If a race is a tie, postponed or cancelled, your parlay is automatically reduced by one selection; a double parlay becomes a straight bet, a triple parlay becomes a double.

DAILY DOUBLE – A bet on the winning horses of two races selected by the track for that day.

FUTURE – A bet on a future event. Odds remain the same as the day the bet was placed regardless of how they are posted on race day.

EXOTIC BETS – Anything other than a Win, Place or Show bet can be considered an exotic bet.

BOXED – A combination bet where any of the chosen horses can finish first for a win, similar to a Quinella. Example: *“A Trifecta Boxed, horses 2-3-7”*. This means that the 2, 3 or 7 horse coming in first would be a win.

KEYED – A bet on a single horse to come in first, second or third with multiple horses either in front or behind. Example: *“A \$1 dollar Pick 3 Keyed, the 2 horse with the 3-4-5 with the 3-4-5-6”*. This means the 2 horse must win the first leg of your pick 3 either the 3-4 or 5 must win the second leg and the 3-4-5 or 6 must win the third leg to win your bet.

WHEELED – Similar to a Key, a bet on a single horses finishing position with multiple horses either in front or behind. Example: *“A \$2 dollar Exacta Wheeled, the 1 horse with the 2-3-4”*. This means the 1 horse must win the race and the 2, 3 or 4 must run second to win the bet. Another example might be a \$2 dollar Exacta the 2-3-4 horse with the 1 this means the 2, 3 or 4 must win and the 1 must run second.

PART WHEEL – Similar to a Wheel but choosing multiple horses in different positions. Example: *“A \$1 dollar Trifecta Part Wheel, the 1-2 horse with 1-2-3 with 1-2-3-4-5”*. This means the 1 or 2 must win the race the 1-2-3 must run second and the 1-2-3-4-5 must finish third for the bet to win. Same theory applies to the exacta and Superfecta.
